#### 5. Three Scenarios for Atlantic Canada

- 1. Status Quo Rough Times + Energy Model
  - a) Low Productivity
  - b) Limited Wage Improvements
  - c) Megaprojects in Energy
  - d) North America does well
- 2. Low Productivity Model but Ottawa Helps
  - a) Ottawa pump priming (NS is 43% dependent on Ottawa)
  - b) Provinces in basic agreement
  - c) Health Care Costs can be contained
  - d) Dollar stays around 0.65 cents
- 3. Bold, Growth Model
  - a) Ottawa is partner (Irish-EU model)
  - b) Region Moves to Intellectual Investment Model
  - c) Only two priorities: Human Capital/Exports-Trade
  - d) Political System moves in tandem with global economic system
